

Alpha Mentoring Program Application

Thank you for your interest in the Alpha Mentoring Program (AMP). This program is designed to address the academic, social, and cultural needs of young minority high school males. Members of the AMP are mentored closely throughout their freshmen and sophomore years of high school in the areas of academic excellence, community awareness, and cultural activism. In subsequent high school years (Junior and Senior) the young men will continue to participate in the program as student mentors and role models for the future incoming Freshmen in the Program.

The program will consist of after school sessions conducted every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each <u>month</u>, beginning on <u>September 6, 2017</u>. Sessions will begin promptly at <u>5:00PM and finish at 7PM</u>. Food will be served to the students. Each month will also consist of an activity that promotes cultural and/or community awareness. Details regarding these activities will be coordinated throughout the year with the students. Students will be required to submit grade checks reports to the program staff once a month. Students will also be required to attend tutoring session for classes deemed to be of concern by the program staff. Students will be required to secure transportation to and from sessions and events.

The AMP Program is incentivized through provisions of scholarships that will be awarded to select students based at the end of each year. Students will be eligible to receive scholarships throughout their entire time in the program. Disbursement of all monies will be awarded to the student upon proof of college and course enrollment. If a student is awarded money and does not remain with the program throughout their entire time in high school, the student is still eligible to receive the award if he meets the requirements to do so. Award amounts will vary. Alpha reserves the right to increase the number of awards given in any year. Students must submit all grade checks, and participate in at least 70% of all program activity identified at the beginning of the year. A minimum of three Awards will be given to students for the following...

- Highest GPA
- Best Attendance (to AMP sessions)
- Most Academically Improved
